

## Kenneth A. Bowman

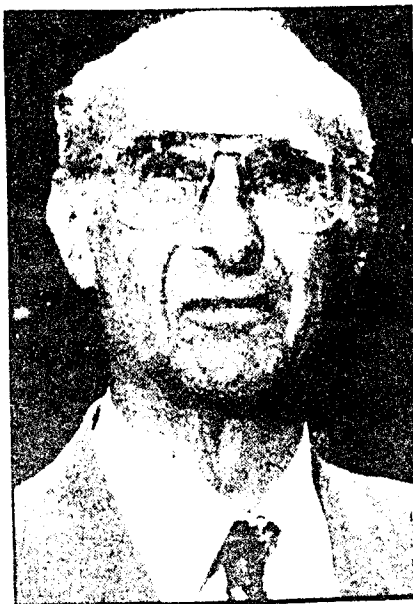
