The woman was stabbed at a party of colored people at a North Diamond street address on Aug. 27, and died the following day.

The state countered attempts of the defense to establish that wounds did not cause her death by placing Dr. B. E. Shreffler on the stand as a rebuttal witness. Dr. Shreffler's testimony was contradictory to that of Dr. Rinehart.
