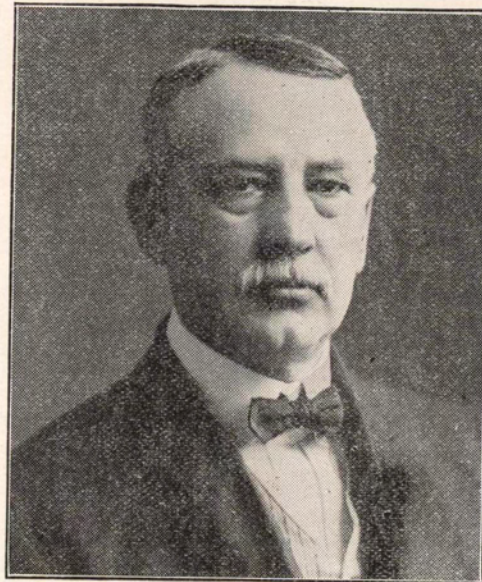
### CENTENNIAL HEADQUARTERS.

### ERRORS AND CORRECTIONS.

Although the proof of this work was carefully read, typographical errors were noticed after the forms were printed. While all of these errors are annoying, some are misleading, one of the latter states that the survey to plat Mansfield was begun on the 19th of June, when the 11th is the correct date. The one hundredth anniversary of the founding of Mansfield will be on Wednesday, June 11, 1908, but the whole of that week will be taken up with the Centennial celebration, which will commence on Monday, June 9th and continue until Saturday, the 15th, one solid week.
