

VOTERS TO DECIDE AT FALL ELECTION

Business Men Want the Court House Question Taken Up at Once

Commissioners to Put the Problem Up to the Citizens

The county commissioners have decided to have the prosecutor draw up a resolution to submit the court house improvement to a vote of the people at the coming election.

"Finish the heating system and put the dome on the court house," is the slogan of the public improvements committee of the Chamber of Commerce which met with the county commissioners this morning. The meeting was held to consider the spending of \$9,000 on the dome and \$7,000 on the completion of the heating system.

The delegation from the Chamber of Commerce was composed of A. F. Remy, J. H. Krause, R. B. Maxwell, C. F. Harding, Capt. H. L. Reed and Vernon Redding.

The committee appeared before the county commissioners in reference to the petition signed by 289 names. It is planned to have the question submitted to the voters at the coming election.

Commissioner Patterson asked whether or not this coming election would be a county election. He said some attorneys had questioned the submitting of the court house problem to the voters this fall. Prosecutor

Prosecutor Huston said it would not be practicable to submit the question at a special election owing to the expense. Before the question could be submitted at this fall's election fifteen day's notice would have to be given by sheriff's proclamation.

The committee was desirous that the commissioners pass a resolution to get the matter before the people for their vote this autumn on account of imperative need of better heating and ventilating.

The committee members said the improvement concerned the entire county and they were sure the proposition would carry if submitted to a vote.

The committee promises to put the facts before the people before the election so that they will have the fullest information and have no doubt as to how the public money is to be spent.
