Anna L. Henry, through Attorneys Kramer & Jarvis, has filed suit for divorce from Harland M. Henry in common pleas court. They were married Sept. 27, 1897 at Perrysville. There are three children born of the marriage, Hobert aged 12, Leonard L. aged 10 and Gladys F. Henry aged 8.

The wife first charges gross neglect of duty. She says ever since May 15, 1909 he has failed and refused to do anything towards the support of their minor children and that she has been compelled to support herself and children.

For a second cause of action she says he has been an habitual drunkard for more than three years past and that for the last ten years he has been a heavy drinker of intoxicants, neglecting his family and finally losing his position on the railroad where he had been employed at good wages.

The wife says she always conducted herself as a dutiful wife and has given him no reason for the conduct complained of. She wants divorce and exclusive care and control of the minor children.
