WILL CUTS OFF GRANDDAUGHTERS IF THEY WED YOUNG MEN NAMED

The last will of Anna Curren,
formerly Anna Farrington, late of
Franklin township, who died Nov. 7,
has been filed for probate. It is
much out of the ordinary.

She directs that all her real estate
and personal property valued at
about \$12,000 be sold by her execu-
tors and all the moneys arising
therefrom are to be invested in U. S.
bonds; that they are to be held by
her executors as trustees for the use
of Nellie Laser and Anna Randall,
her granddaughters. The bonds are
to be held by her trustees until the
granddaughters have attained the of
age of 25 years. In case either of
the granddaughters should marry
any of the sons of William Perman.
of Shelby, O., (the second husband of
her daughter Bertha Perman) then
she provides that the granddaughter

so marrying the son shall have no
interest in the bonds but the same
shall go to the other granddaughter.

In the event that either grand-
daughter dies before attaining the
age of 25 or should marry sons of
William Perman before they are 25,
then it is her will that the bonds and
interest shall be held in trust for
the use and benefit of the Children's
Home of Richland county. In case
the institution should have ceased to
exist then it is her will that the ex-
ecutors transfer the bonds to the
trustees of any similar institution in
Ohio.

She appoints Edwin Mansfield and
B. F. Long as executors of the will
which was dated June 16, 1908, and
witnessed by G. E. Verbeck and
Nellie F. Long.
