MANSFIELD — Charles A. Bowman, 79, of Mansfield died Saturday morning, March 6, 1999, in Kingston Care Center of Ashland after a long illness.

He was born July 19, 1919 in Butler to Charles O. and Grace Smith Bowman and had been a lifelong Mansfield area resident.

Mr. Bowman was a World War II veteran, serving with the 101st Airborne Division in the European Theater. He saw action at the Normandy Invasion and the Battle of the Bulge. He was a member of the 101st Airborne Association and a life member of the Disabled Veterans of America.

He owned and operated Bowman's Antenna Service for 20 years and retired in 1979 as zone man from White-Westinghouse with 39 years of service.

An avid antique car enthusiast, he was a charter member of both the Shelman and Mohican Model A. Clubs.
