

MANSFIELD PHYSICIAN IS A PRISONER AT COLOGNE

DR. SEELEY ATTEMPTED TO
CROSS INTO HOLLAND WITH-
OUT THEIR PERMISSION.

The state department advised Senator Harding's office yesterday at Washington that Dr. F. N. Seeley, of Mansfield, Ohio, is being held at Cologne for an attempt to cross the border into Holland without the consent of the German authorities. The department reported that efforts to soften the demeanor of Germany toward Dr. Seeley are unavailing. He has been sent to prison to remain as long as the European war lasts. His family and children are reported to be in want.

El Paso, Tex., Dec. 23.—General Obregon, commander-in-chief of the Mexican forces in northern Mexico, announced he would enter Juarez just across the border today.

Juarez passed its first night under Carranza control in peace. There is still some uneasiness felt by the officials of the de facto government over the whereabouts of General Villa and as to the attitude of General Jose Rodriguez toward the surrendered agreement. Emissaries have been sent to Rodriguez to secure his adherence to the agreement.

Carranza Suspends Decree

Washington, D. C., Dec. 23.—In the face of official foreign protests General Carranza has temporarily suspended his decree requiring banks in Mexico City to redeem their notes in gold according to advices received today by the state department. The suspension is effective for an indefinite date. Embassy officials here recently urged Secretary Lansing to request Carranza to modify the decree, asserting that its enforcement would lead to international complications.

General Villa's Brother Arrested

SUES FOR \$1000 BUT JURY SAYS HE SHOULD HAVE \$5

JACOB BEAM GIVEN VERDICT WHICH FALLS FAR LOWER THAN WHAT HE WISHED.

Jacob Beam thought his injuries from the Ford automobile of Grover Smith inconvenienced him to the extent of \$1,000 and said so emphatically by his Attorneys Reed & Beach. The jury, however, in common pleas court after a careful consideration of the facts in the case decided that all Jacob should have was a measly \$5 and rendered a verdict in his favor for that amount. Smith was represented by Attorneys McBride & Wolfe who claimed that Beam had been guilty of contributory negligence. The jury returned its verdict late Wednesday afternoon after having been carefully directed by Judge Mansfield.

Beam sued for injuries received when he was struck by the Smith machine while crossing Park avenue east near the courthouse. It had turned onto that street from South Diamond street. Beam claimed that it was going 30 miles an hour while Smith said 'twas but two per hour.
